I, **NAME OF SIGNATORY** at **NAME OF CHAMBER OF COMMERCE**, hereby certify the following :

- (i) Due to the military invasion by Russia in Ukraine since 24th February 2022, the European Union has adopted trade sanctions with respect to the Russian Federation.
- (ii) Customs authorities in the European Union performed and/or may perform additional verifications on goods shipped for export from the European Union to the Russian Federation, for the purpose of verifying whether such goods are covered by said trade sanctions or not.
- (iii) Due to the circumstances mentioned above under (i) and (ii), trade with the Russian Federation has been seriously dislocated and companies' abilities to fulfil their contractual obligations with respect to such trade is seriously impacted.
- (iv) The circumstances mentioned above under (i) and (ii) could be taken into account to demonstrate Force Majeure*.
- (v) The duration of the circumstances mentioned above under (i) and (ii) cannot be assessed.
